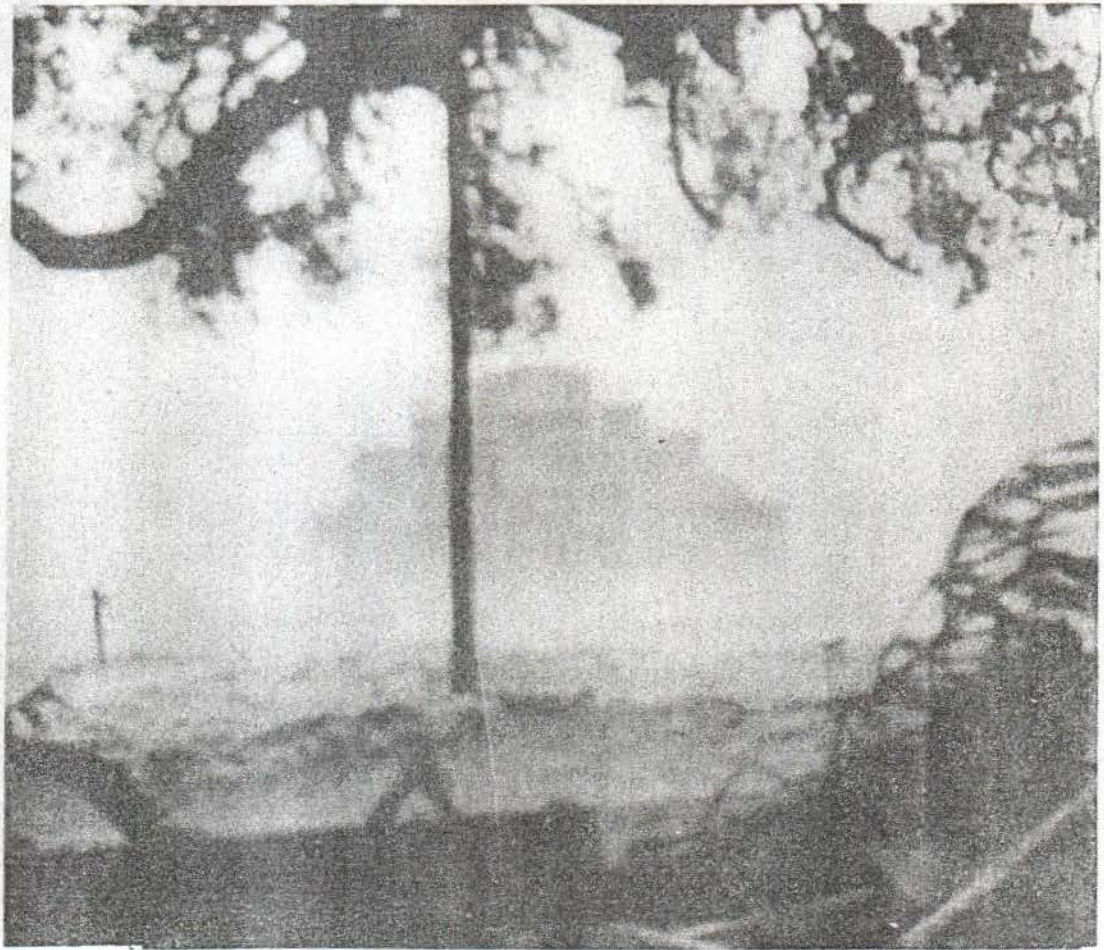

It is my sincere wish that each of you will at all times exercise care in preserving our nautical and social relationship created through the medium of this annual renewal of friendship.



BILOXI - The Beautiful (and damned)

Nestling among evergreen moss-draped oaks that grow to the water's edge along an irregular peninsula shoreline, Biloxi looks out over the waters of the Mississippi Sound. Rich in historic interest, quaint in individuality, fascinating in natural beauty, the City combines the alluring atmosphere of the Old South with the spirit of the new in a charming four season resort.

In the year of 1699 the French, under Pierre la Moyne d'Iberville established the first capital of the Louisiana Province, on the Bay of Biloxi. This same territory later became the Louisiana Purchase.

The seafood industry has been the back-bone of Biloxi's growth, Biloxi being the largest provider of shrimp and oysters in the world. This industry has also given Biloxi its cosmopolitan flavor thru the large number of native Jugo Slavs, Austrians, French and other nationalities that have emigrated to Biloxi as seafood workers.

Having the finest hotel accommodations in the Tri-state area, it was natural that Biloxi would become the Convention City of the South. Not only state and regional, but national organizations hold their conventions annually in Biloxi.

Mississippi State law prohibits the sale of any alcoholic beverages except light wines and 3.2 beer. From the large number of bars, clubs saloons, lounges, night clubs, etc., it is possible that this law is not rigidly enforced in Biloxi.

These beverage dispensing places, the fine hotels, the large number of modern motels, the sand beach, numerous swimming pools, fishing, sailing, and a year round delightful climate combine to make Biloxi the most popular resort city from St. Petersburg to Sun Valley.

Keesler Air Force Base, the electronic training center of the entire Air Force, is located within the city limits of Biloxi. Just a few miles west, on the Beach Drive, is the Headquarters of the Technical Training Air Force. Just west of Keesler Field is the Veterans Home and Hospital, known as the show place of the Coast because of its beautiful oaks, pines, flowering shrubs, and stately colonial buildings.

So why not stay on a few days, or if that is not possible, come back later and enjoy all that Biloxi has to offer.
