

#### Captain Dave Witherill



With most sincere regret, it was learned that Cap'n Dave will not be on this year's Pensacola Yacht Club Lipton Team, due to a recent fall that resulted in a broken hip. Cap'n Dave has skippered in all previous Fish Class Liptons and his extraordinary ability as a skipper and his proven good sportmanship have been the main topic of many a bull session rehashing past Lipton Regattas.

We take great pleasure in calling your attention to some of the highlights of Caph Dave's enviable record as an outstanding Gulf Coast Yachtsman and a truly great Southern Gentlemen.

Cap'n Dave was born in Fon Du Lac, Wisconsin, moving to St. Andrews Bay at the age of 12 where he learned to sail, as it was the only means of transportation. In 1894 Cap'n Dave designed and built a 26' sail boat that was for years the fastest boat on St. Andrews Bay.

Cap'n Dave Cap'n Dave moved to Pensacola in 1902 and built and operated a passenger and freight boat between Pensacola and Fort Walton. In 1908 the Pensacola Yacht Club was organized with Cap'n Dave as a charter member. This same year he entered the marine supply business.

Cap'n Dave became interested in the Fish Class when the first boats were built and skippered in the first Lipton Regatta in 1920, which was won by Pensacola Yacht Club. He skippered for Pensacola in every Lipton through 1953 and was largely responsible for Pensacola winning the Championship eight times and tying twice with Southern Yacht Club.

Two outstanding accomplishments of Cap'n Dave's skippering during Lipton Regattas occured at St. Petersburg. In 1927 Cap'n Dave (under the old rules) skippered in three sixteen boat races and amassed a total of 44 points out of a possible 48 points'. In 1933 the last race of the Lipton's was sailed in the face of an approaching hurricane. The Fish boats were double-reefed, however gusts of hurricane force were too much for the competition and Cap'n Dave won by a big margin, only one other boat actually finishing the race before capsizing. After crossing the finish line, Cap'n Dave nonchalantly came-about, sailed back to the harbor and rounded up in the proper slip. He always enjoyed a little breeze!

Cap'n Dave's 34 successful years in Fish Class competition have clearly demonstrated his uncanny sailing ability, which is greatly admired. He is even more esteemed by fellow yachtsmen for his proven perfect sportsmanship, his unfailing good humor and his warm friendship. In fact, in these qualities, Cap'n Dave is equalled only by his dear wife, Ruth, who is known by all as Cap'n Dave's staunchest supporter.

#### HISTORY OF FISH CLASS

Rathbone DeBuys, Chairman of the Southern Yacht Club Race Committee in 1919, designed and promoted the Fish Class and is affectionately referred to as the "Daddy of the Fish Class".

This healthy, durable class of sloop was created with the following objects in mind:

- To return sailing to the importance to which it is entitled in yachting in the South;
  - To return sailing to the importance to which it is entitled in yachting in the South;
  - 2. To develop competition between good sportsmen;
  - 3. To develop nautical skill and prowess;
  - To develop self reliance in the growing young men and women, and to afford them a healthy sport in which they may accomplish this object;;
  - 5. To afford Yacht Clubs a means to develop new sailors.

Shortly after the celebration of its 70th anniversary, the Southern Yacht Club received from that Prince of all Yachtmen, Sir Thomas J. Lipton, a letter dated October 22, 1919, in which he stated that he was having made from an original designed a trophy, to be presented to the Southern Yacht Club. In this letter, he expressed the desire that it be used as a Challenge Trophy under whatever conditions the Southern Yacht Club considered best. It was decided by the officials of this club to yse it as a perpetual challenge trophy to be sailed for by the Yacht Clubs bordering on the Gulf of Mexico, who owned Fish Class Fleets.

The next year, 1920, the first Regatta to determine possession of this Lipton Trophy was held on Lake Ponchartrain between the Southern Club and the Pensacola Yacht Club. Three races were sailed, and each club sailed three boats in each race. The Pensacola Club won by a score of 32-28. At this regatta, the Gulf Yachting Association was formed, and on October 3, 1920, Commodore John H. Cross, of the Pensacola Yacht Club, was elected its first president.

The next year, 1921, the Lipton Regatta was held in Pensacola with the Houston Yacht Club and the Eastern Shore Yacht Club of Mobile also participating. This series of races was won by the Mobile Club, with Pensacola Yacht Club second.

Annual Lipton Trophy Regattas were held every subsequent year to date, including the difficult World War II years, to thi our Thirty-fifth Annual Regatta; The continued growth of the Gulf Yachting Association and the continued increase in size, enthusiasm and wide-spreadinterest in the Fish Class Liptons proves this important yachting event will continue to expand for many years to come.

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- 9:20 am Warning Signal One Gun
- 9:25 am Preparatory Signal One Gun & hoisting Red Shape
- 9:30 am Starting Signal One Gun & hoisting Red Shape

#### Afternoon Races

- 2:00 pm Drawing for Boats
- 2:50 pm Warning Signal One Gun
- 2:55 pm Preparatory Signal One Gun & hoisting Red Shape
- 3:00 pm Starting Signal One Gun & hoisting Red Shape

Preparatory Signal will be lowered 30 seconds before Starting Signal. The Starting Signal will remain hoisted until the race committee is on station at the finish line.

In case of misfire the visual signal shall be considered the starting signal.

Time Limit; Three and one-half (3%) hours.

Signalling the Course: The Race Committee shall display the Course Signal before or with the Warning Signal.

Signals (Shapes or Code Flags or Guns)

Warning Signal - One Gun

Preparatory Signal - Red Shape & One Gun

Starting Signal - Red Shape & One Gun

Shorten Course - "S" (blue square on white)

Postponement - "P" (white square on blue)

Warning Signal will be given 5 minutes after "P" is lowered

Cancellation - "C" (red, white and blue stripes)


Finish Signal - "F" (red diamond on white)

The Race Committee is on station at the Finish Line.

Calling Attention to Signals: Two Guns or whistles when displaying "P" or "C". One Gun or whistle when making any other signal.

Course Signals will be displayed at the Race Committee Station and designated as follows: (It will be noted that the standard course includes two rounds of the Triangle ABC or ACB unless the Shorten Course Signal "S" is displayed)

Course "E", From the Starting Line to Mark No. 1 (leave to port) to

Stake Boats will be stationed at Marks "B" and "C" the exact location of which will be varied to suit wind conditions.

Short Course Signal: The Race Committee may shorten above courses before the Warning Signal by displaying Shape "S' with the Course Signal which will eliminate one round of the Triangle "A". "B". "C".

Shorten Course Signal: The Race Committee may shorten above courses upon or after one complete round of the Triangle "A", "B", "C", by displaying Shape "S" on the Committee Boat, which means the race will be finished between the nearby Mark and the Committee Boat. A Committee Boat will not be used unless it is necessary to Shorten Course.

Starting and Finish Lines will be between the White Flag at the Committee Station and the Yellow Starting Mark unless the course is shortened, in which case it will be between the White Flag on the Committee Boat and the nearby Mark. The Race Committee may angle the Starting Line to suit wind conditions, however the Finish Line will be at approximately right angles to the last leg of the Course.

Government Beacons No. 6, 8 & 10 must be passed on the Channel Side (West Side) at all times and are Marks of the Course. Other Government Beacons and Channel Bouys may be passed on either side and are obstructions.

Stakes Marking Shoal Waters are not Marks and may be passed on either side at the contestant's risk, however a hail for Sea-room or room to Tack when close aboard these Stakes will be deemed proper. Touching these stakes will not be grounds for disqualification.

Racing Rules: The 1954 North American Yacht Racing Rules will apply, except as modified by Gulf Yachting Association Rules and these instructions,

All Clear Statements: These statements must be signed by each skipper and filed with the R. C. Chairman within one hour after the finish, unless contestant plans to protest. Failure to comply with this instruction will result in disqualification without hearing.

Protest, Protest Flags: All protest, claims of fouls or complaints must be filed in writing with the secretary of the G. Y. A. or his representative within one hour after completion of the race in which it occurred.

Protest flags (or their equivalent) must be flown before completion of the race, except when the foul or fouls occurred at the Finish Line, in which case the Protest flag shall be displayed immediately thereafter.

Hearing of Fouls: The Lipton Board of Appeals shall have original or exclusive jurisdiction of all fouls, complaints, and protests arising out of any race, or races and its decision shall be final. Involved contestants shall make themselves available to the Lipton Board of Appeals for Hearings. Failure to appear when called may result in disqualification without hearing.

Premature Starts, Recalling: The Race Committee will use a loud speaker to recall yachts that have started prematurely by calling out her number. Failure to hear or heed such recall shall not relieve a yacht from the necessity of making a proper start.

The Race Course Chart: This chart shall be an official part of these instructions. Please study carefully and if you do not fully understand ask the Race Committee for clarification.

Point Scoring; A yacht shall score one point for finishing a race and one additional point for each yacht defeated.

Each Yacht finishing after a disqualified contestant shall score one additional point.

The winning yacht of each race will score one-quarter point additional.

If two or more Clubs end in a point tie the winner will be the Club whose yachts finished ahead of the others the majority of times.
