The History of the

Sir Thomas Lipton Challenge Trophy

Sir Thomas Lipton, BART, K.C.V.O., multimillionaire tea merchant was born in Ireland in 1849 to indigent parents, lived for a while in New Orleans where his job was driving a mule drawn streetcar. In later life he five times challenged, unsuccessfully, for the America's Cup in his famous "Shamrock's". Although losing each time he won the hearts of the American people and the world for epitomizing good sportsmanship.

In 1919, in observance of the 70th Anniversary of the Southern Yacht Club, Sir Thomas presented the beautiful challenge Trophy known to us affectionately as the Lipton Cup to be raced for by one-design sloops. This gift was accomplished largely through the efforts of William H. Parham, then secretary of Southern Yacht Club. It was through the efforts of Mr. Parham and of Mr. Rathbone DeBuys, New Orleans Architect, who while Race Committee Chairman of Southern Yacht Club designed the Fish Class Sloop as a club owned boat, that the Board of Governors of the Southern Yacht Club loaned the Sir Thomas Lipton Challenge Trophy to the Gulf Yachting Association as the prize for the interclub Fish Class Championship Regatta, which has become familiarly known as the Lipton Series.

After 50 years of competition in the Fish Class and several years of discussion and contemplation, the Fish Class was abandoned in favor of the Flying Scot Class. Main features of this class which differ from the Fish Class are the marconi rig, centerboard, spinnaker, and low-maintenance fiberglass hull. Flying Scots were inaugurated for Lipton Cup competition in 1969.

Annually, on Labor Day weekend, hundreds of skippers, crews, officials and spectators gather at one of the Gulf Yachting Association member clubs and participate in the highlight of the yachting year - the annual Regatta for the Sir Thomas Lipton Challenge Trophy.
