### **Preface**

#### (From Original Book)

In 1992, GYA Commodore Basil Kennedy and others recognized that the Gulf Yachting Association and its member clubs owned or had custodial responsibility over a number of valuable perpetual trophies, but virtually no accountability procedure to insure their protection. Therefore, he urged the Board of Directors to create a Trophy Committee and appointed Past GYA Commodore Henry G. Chapman to chair that committee. It has been said that committees are oftentimes created with little cause or direction, but the work of the Trophy Committee over the last eight years has been a success story without equal.

The committee found what many suspected: trophies were in disrepair; many were not current in their engraving; some, literally, were lost; and, many rarely showed up at the venue at which they were to be awarded. In short, there was virtually no accountability program, which is a prerequisite for any more sophisticated system of documentation and preservation. The Trophy Committee implemented such an accountability program in 1995, and the procedure, itself, is relatively simple. The winning skipper or club of a perpetual trophy which travels from venue to venue must sign an accountability form holding the winner responsible for the care of the trophy, its engraving, and its return to the appropriate venue the following year. While simple in its essence, the procedure carries far-reaching benefits for the future protection of these intrinsically valuable trophies.

The accountability procedure, however, could not correct overnight the myriad problems associated with the GYA's perpetual trophies. The Trophy Committee set about on a program of research and documentation that involved countless hours and many individuals—none more so than Chairman Chapman and committee member/secretary Mug Cole. Many people were asked to consult their personal records to determine missing winners or locate missing deeds of gift. Hours of research were conducted in the GYA Archives housed at the University of West Florida. New deeds of gift were drafted where none existed or were inadequate at best. Custodial responsibility was assigned or clarified based on the deeds of gift. The committee urged donors to allow the trophies to continue to travel, when some were leaning the other way for prior obvious reasons. Carrying cases were made (and are still being made) and in some cases donated to the GYA to insure the trophies' protection. Records pertaining to individual trophies were updated as far as humanly possible. Trophies were photographed and scale drawings made to enable their reproduction, or, at least, insure for posterity permanent documentary evidence of their appearance. Where needed, trophies were repaired as funds became available.

The foregoing represents merely the highlights of the outstanding work of the Trophy Committee. Suffice it to say that much was done behind the scenes and with little fanfare to create a living historical record of these—the GYA's most coveted assets.

What follows is a volume so complete as to represent in and of itself a history of the Gulf Yachting Association and a partial retelling of the events and individuals making up that history. It can be said that history is two-faceted. It is both the collective memories of the men and women who played a prominent role in its creation, as well as the tangible remnants of that past, which, unlike memory, is physical and hence indisputable. The perpetual trophies contained herein are just that—the tangible remnants of the history of the GYA—that tell us who we are and where we have been. They assure us that the past is never really dead, it is merely past. They assure us, further, that a physical link will always exist between generations of sailors now gone and those yet born—those who will someday be the stewards of our history, just as we are today.

### **Commodore J. Gilbert Scheib Trophy**

The Commodore J. Gilbert Scheib trophy is a sterling silver covered loving cup with long slim handles gracefully extending from the top to the bottom of the cup. The cup sits on a graduated rounded base made of wood.

The base holding the loving cup sits atop a black wooden four sided base with displays engraved plates for the annual winning club. Each side of the base holds eight engraved plates.

The square base holding the plates rests on a 1" thick square with graduated molding.



Handles measure 10 ¼"

Overall height measures 14 14"

Diameter of cup is 6"

Wooden graduated molding the cup sits on is 1¼" high

Diameter of cup base is 4 ¾"

### DEED OF GIFT

#### COMMODORE J. GILBERT SCHEIB PERPETUAL TROPHY FOR THE WINNER OF THE GULF YACHTING ASSOCIATION OPENING REGATTA

The Commodore J.Gilbert Scheib Perpetual Trophy is dedicated to encourage proficiency in nautical and sportsmanlike conduct in sailboat racing between the teams representing the various member yacht clubs of the Gulf Yachting Association.

This trophy is also emblematic and is to serve as a memorial to the deceased members of the yacht clubs who in the past have won the Opening Regattas of the Gulf Yachting Association.

This trophy shall be awarded to the club winning this series and same shall be prominently displayed in the club house of the winning club for one year.

A Marker Trophy shall be awarded annually by the Gulf Yachting Association to the club winning the Commodore J.Gilbert Scheib Trophy, and this Marker Trophy shall be displayed in the club house of the winning club.

The club in possession of this trophy shall provide for its security against damage, loss, theft or vandalism and said club shall keep the Gulf Yachting Association informed through its Secretary if for any cuase the foregoing is not fulfilled. The Gulf Yachting Association has a floater policy covering all of its perpetual trophies. The winning club, at its cost, shall provide a small engraved plate to be affixed to the wooden base of this trophy to conform with previous plates.

The Gulf Yachting Association club in possession of this trophy shall be responsible and accountable for its safe keeping and shall deliver same in good order to the host club holding the next annual meeting and Opening Regatta of the Gulf Yachting Association so that this trophy together with the Marker Trophy provided by the Gulf Yachting Association may be presented to the winning club.

If for any cause or reason this trophy is removed or withdrawn by the donor or his heirs, or if not competed for in sailing in club-owned boats, this trophy shall be returned in good order to the family of the donor until further interest covering this trophy is reestablished.

The Southern Yacht Club is named by the donor as the Trustee for this trophy. A description of this trophy and a picture of same is attached to this Deed of Gift.

#### Deed of Gift

Deed of Gift

for the

Commodore John Dane Memorial Trophy

In order to advance the sport of sailboat racing among the senior members of the Gulf Yachting Association, this deed of gift and the Commodore John Dane Memorial Trophy are presented to the GYA in Commodore Dane's memory for "Old Timers" competition. The trophy is a sterling silver loving cup won by my father, Commodore Dane, in 1929 in a predicted log power boat race from New Orleans to the Mississippi Gulf Coast. Commodore Dane was commodore of the Southern Yacht Club in 1937-38.

The trophy is to be competed for annually at the GYA Opening Regatta, and sailed for in the same class boat as adopted by the GYA for interclub competition in clubowned sailboats. Skippers and crew members must have reached their 50<sup>th</sup> birthday in order to compete. The names of the winning skippers and crew members are to be inscribed on the trophy's base, and suitable keeper trophies are to be presented to the winning skippers and crew members.

The trophy is to be displayed at the yacht club of the winning skippers, engraved with their names, and returned by the winners to the Opening Regatta host club unless the GYA elects to take more restrictive steps to protect the trophy.

If interest in competition for the trophy does not continue, the GYA may rededicate it for another purpose.

#### AMEMDMENT TO DEED OF GIFT

OF

#### COMMODORE JOHN DANE MEMORIAL TROPHY AWARDED TO WINNING MASTERS TEAM

Whereas the GYA desires to continue awarding the Commodore John Dane Memorial Trophy to honor Commodore John Dane's memory for "Old Timers" competition, and

Whereas the Trophy is to be competed for annually and awarded at the GYA Opening Regatta, and

Whereas the GYA has adopted a new class boat for the interclub competition in club owned sailboats, and

Whereas the 2nd paragraph of the Deed of Gift reads in part that the trophy is "sailed for in the same class boat as adopted by the GYA for interclub competition in club owned sailboats.", and

Whereas that I, John Dane III, the son of Commodore John Dane, Junior, am his direct descendant and authorized to request changes to the original Deed of Gift,

I, therefore, direct that the 1st sentence of the 2<sup>nd</sup> paragraph of the Deed of Gift be amended to read: "The trophy is to be competed for annually at the GYA Opening Regatta and sailed for in a GYA approved boat designated by the One Design Council/Committee."

All other requirements of the Deed of Gift remain in effect.

#### Junior Lipton Trophy

This will document the purchase and dedication by the Gulf Yachting Association in the year 1941 of the Junior Lipton Trophy, a large revere bowl, for interclub competition among junior sailors in club-owned boats. The trophy is dedicated in memory of Sir Thomas Lipton, and is to be competed for by junior sailors, who, by the rules of the time, were not permitted to sail in the Lipton Cup races.

The trophy is to be awarded annually at the Junior Lipton Regatta to the yacht club which has acquired the best scores in the series, to be normally held in July or August, and a suitable keeper trophy is to be presented to the winner.

The trophy is to be displayed at the winning yacht club, engraved with that club's name, and returned by the winner to the club hosting the regatta the following year.







#### The Commodore Leslie P. Beard Trophy

This will document the acquisition and dedication by the Gulf Yachting Association in the year 1967 of the Commodore Leslie P. Beard Trophy, a goblet/chalice type cup, as a memorial to Commodore Beard.

Commodore Beard was Commodore of the Gulf Yachting Association in 1942 and 1943, and was a past Commodore of the Southern Yacht Club. He was known for his sailing prowess and served as Chairman of the Lipton Board of Appeals for many years.

It was the fond and earnest desire of the late Commodore Beard that Junior members of GYA member yacht clubs grow into men and women of honor, respect and achievement, not in sailing ability alone, but rather through a well-rounded career of service and value to fellow juniors, to senior members and to their respective yacht clubs.

The Commodore Leslie P. Beard Trophy was established in 1967 in his memory by the Gulf Yachting Association with donations for its purchase by the member clubs, members of the Beard family and other interested individuals. The trophy was originally awarded each year at the annual meeting of the Gulf Yachting Association to the Junior-member group, which, in the judgement of the Awarding Committee, best exemplified those characteristics that Commodore Beard held so dear.

In keeping with the original intent, the trophy has been, since 1989, awarded to the Junior Lipton sailing team which best exemplifies sportsmanship on and off the racecourse during the annual Junior Lipton Regatta. The recipient is selected by vote of the participants and regatta officials.

The GYA Board of Directors may, upon proper vote, change the purpose for which the trophy is awarded. A keeper award shall be presented by the host club to the team winning this trophy.



This will confirm the dedication in 1974 of the exact 1/2 model of the Sir Thomas Lipton Interclub Challenge Cup by the Southern Yacht Club to the Gulf Yachting Association, to be presented annually to the yacht club successfully challenging for, or defending its possession of the cup. ### Rebuilt Sir Thomas J. Lipton Interclub Challenge Cup

(Original Trophy Lost in Fire at Southern Yacht Club Resulting From Hurricane Katrina August 23, 2005)



This 39" tall silver cup was presented to Southern Yacht Club by the great tea magnate, Sir Thomas Lipton in 1919 as a challenge trophy. Following Lipton's wishes, SYC offered the Trophy for interclub races between clubs in the Gulf Coast Area. This was followed by the first challenge in October 1920, the beginning of the now 81-year-old competition for this yacht racing prize, competed for by clubs in the Northern Gulf area.

Later the same year in Mobile, Alabama, the Southern Gulf Coast Yachting Association was reorganized as the Gulf Yachting Association.

The trophy was allowed to travel from winning club to winning club until 1974, when, for protection purposes, SYC elected to keep it in its clubhouse, and arranged for a half-model to be cast and to be displayed at each winning club.

#### THE SIR THOMAS LIPTON INTERCLUB CHALLENGE CUP

One of the most valuable perpetual trophies owned by the Southern Yacht Club, this sterling silver piece is inscribed with the following hallmarks:

The Murray family gives to the Gulf Yachting Association a perpetual trophy described to wit:

A two handled sterling silver cup (11" H, 10.5" wide) on a walnut pedestal base.

The sterling cup is engraved with a double burgee, "GYA" (in reverse) and "M•GS", and "Most Improved." Walnut pedestal base measures 7.5"L x 7.5" W x 4 3/4" H. Total height 15.5."

This trophy was first given in 1994 by Tim Murray, through his magazine Mid-Gulf Sailing, to recognize the team that most improved their standing in the Lipton Regatta from one year to the next. Tim Murray, who passed away in 2005, believed that maintaining the Corinthian spirit was key to sustaining competition. The overall goal of awarding this trophy is to encourage participation in sailing competition while making all teams feel their importance in the process. The secondary goal is to memorialize Tim Murray, a competitor in the sailing community who we believe exemplified the Corinthian spirit.

The trophy is to be named the Tim Murray Memorial Trophy and is to be presented annually to the most improved GYA team at the Sir Thomas Lipton Challenge. The winning team must not have places in the top 5 in the previous year's regatta. The trophy shall reside at the home of the winning team and shall be returned at the next Sir Thomas Lipton Challenge competition.

In the event of insufficient interest or for other reasons this trophy is no longer awarded for this purpose, the trophy may be rededicated to another GYA sanctioned competition and/or championship, subject to the approval of the GYA Board of Directors. Should the trophy be retired, the trophy shall reside permanently at Southern Yacht Club.







Commodore Janet R. Miller-Schmidt Trophy

We, The Women Pontchartrain Yacht Club, give to the Gulf Yachting Association a perpetual trophy described to wit:

A Sterling Silver Chalice with a gold lined bowl made in Hanau, Germany by J. D. Schleissner & Sons, No. 7474. The chalice is 10 ½ inches tall.

The overall base for the trophy is an eight sided cypress pedestal which is 9 7/8 inches high. The bottom of the base is 7/8 inches high by 12 1/8 inches deep and 13 15/16 inches wide. Around the edge of this base are six, stainless steel, engraving plates, 3 ½ inches by 1¾ inches engraved with the names of the donors of this trophy. The upper portion of the base is 8 inches high by 7¾ deep and 11 3/8 inches wide. It has six sides which are 4½ inches wide by 8 inches high and two sides which are 3 ¼ inches wide by 8 inches high. The two name plates on the trophy are 3½ by 6 inches stainless steel and the two logo plates are 2½ inches by 3 inches, each has the GYA Burgee and the Pontchartrain Yacht Club burgee centered on the plates. There are 20, 3½ inches by 1 inch stainless steel engraving plates on the upper base for the winners information. The font on the engraving plates shall be Times New Roman in 12 points and will contain the year, the winning boat's name, the winning club's name and the winning skipper's name in that order.

This trophy is to be so named the "Commodore Janet R. Miller-Schmidt Trophy" and is to be presented annually to the winning boat in the GYA Challenge Cup, Class D.

We deem the GYA Challenge Cup, Class D, should be recognized with a perpetual trophy. Janet began her GYA sailing career in Class D, aboard Gene Finnell's, Pearson 28, ISIS in 1988. Because Janet served as the first female Commodore of the Gulf Yachting Association (GYA) in 2006, she deserves this special recognition. Within the GYA, she has served as the first President of the GYA Foundation, the GYA Secretary-Treasurer for many years, and on several GYA committees, sailed in many GYA Sanctioned and US Sailing events, served as a US Sailing certified judge, as a member of numerous race committees for GYA events and continues to serve the GYA.

Each time the Challenge Cup is contested this trophy shall be delivered to the hosting yacht club and shall be awarded to the highest placing GYA club's boat in Class D of the GYA Challenge Cup. It shall be engraved with the year awarded, the name of the winning boat, the GYA winning club and the name of the GYA winning skipper, in that order, on one of the trophy's stainless steel engraving plates. The trophy will reside at Pontchartrain Yacht Club when not awarded.

In the event the GYA Challenge Cup, Class D, ceases to have a GYA Sanction, we would stipulate, with GYA Board approval and the approval of Pontchartrain Yacht Club Board of Directors, the "Commodore Janet R. Miller-Schmidt Trophy" be rededicated to another GYA Sanctioned Championship.

Upon retirement, the trophy is to reside in perpetuity at Pontchartrain Yacht Club. Should Pontchartrain yacht Club no longer exist, the trophy shall become the property of Janet's family.







Whereas the GYA desires to provide for greater security for the Commodore Eugene Taylor Trophy, and

Whereas the Z<sup>nd</sup> paragraph of the deed of gift for that trophy reads in part that the Trophy "...is to be held and retained by the winner until the next annual series.", and,

Whereas the 3<sup>rd</sup> paragraph of the deed reads in part that "The club of which the participant is a member shall be fully responsible for the return of the trophy in good order and condition, prior to the holding of each annual event...", and,

Whereas a club can hardly be held responsible for the return of a trophy that is not in its care, custody and control, and,

Whereas neither Commodore Taylor nor any descendant of his is living today (see enclosed letter dated October 7, 1999),

In the interest of providing the same security for the Commodore Eugene Taylor Trophy that is provided for all other GYA perpetual trophies,

The GYA hereby directs that the 1st sentence of the 2nd paragraph of the deed of gift be amended to read: "This trophy is to be sailed for in annual competition by the Lightning Class and is to be held and retained by the winner's club until the next annual series." (changed wording is underlined), and further directs that this amendment be attached to the deed of gift and be made a part thereof.

The member yacht club of the Gulf Yachting Association shall agree upon providing safekeeping in its yacht club for the one year in its possession, and shall immediately report to the Secretary-Treasurer of the Gulf Yachting Association any damages, theft, etc., if incurred while in its possession.

In the event insufficient interest or other reasons occur in the sailing of match races, the Gulf Yachting Association shall have the right to designate some other perpetual and annual sailing interest commensurate with the purpose of advancing and encouraging the science of sailing and yachting, however, if it fails to do so, the trophy shall be delivered to the Southern Yacht Club to be rededicated and placed into competition, and said Southern Yacht Club then shall assume the same responsibilities as is provided herein as it applies to the Gulf Yachting Association.

Any and all rules and regulations pertaining to competition for the Schweppes Trophy, as set forth in the foregoing or as may be amended therewith by the Gulf Yachting Association, acting through its Board of Directors or its officially designated representatives, shall be binding upon all participants and shall be final, and nothing herein shall be construed to alter the rules and regulations covering the Schweppes (U.S.A.) #### Knost Perpetual Trophy

The perpetual trophy known as "The Knost Trophy" was given to the Gulf Yachting Association by Commodore Bernard L. Knost in 1938 to encourage the sport of sailing among the women members of the yacht clubs comprising the Gulf Yachting Association.

Annual competition for the trophy is held in waters off the Pass Christian Yacht Club. The Pass Christian Yacht Club is the trustee of the trophy and is empowered to conduct the competition. Each club in the Gulf Yachting Association is invited to enter a team. A team consists of three women designated as "skippers" or helmswomen - one skipper plus crew for each of the three races. A person can skipper in only one race. However, crew members may sail in more than one race, and "skippers" may crew in races other than their own.

The Pass Christian Yacht Club and the Gulf Yachting Association designate the weekend dates each year for the competition. The boats to be used are the one-design, club owned boats selected by the Gulf Yachting Association.


The Knost Trophy races are conducted under the international sailboat racing rules as adapted by the Gulf Yachting Association. Specific to the "Knost Regatta", all skippers and crew members must be women 12 years of age or older. No males are allowed to help in the proximate preparation of the boat prior to a race. Procedures for last minute repairs must be approved by the Race Committee. Males may assist with remote preparations such as trailering and hoisting.

The scoring system in use by the Gulf Yachting Association establishes numeric scores. The Knost Trophy is presented to the winning club; however, the trophy is retained by PCYC. The winning club's name is inscribed on the trophy along with the year of triumph. First second and third place plaques are presented to these top teams for permanent display in their home clubs. Individual trophies are awarded for each race to the top three skippers and crews.

The Knost Trophy competition is fully sanctioned by the Gulf Yachting Association and any club points earned apply to competition for the Capdevielle Trophy.

Since the death of Commodore Knost in 1962 various members of the Knost family have sponsored the regatta.

KNOST Trophy shall be conducted in accordance with the racing rules of the North American Yacht Racing Union and shall also follow the current rules as to eligibility, etc. of the Women's National Sailing Championship. The control and jurisdiction of the races for the COMMODORE BERNARD L. KNOST Trophy will be by mutual consent of the Yacht Racing Associations within the Southern Area of the North American Yacht Racing Union.

The Gulf Yachting Association is hereby named and designated as trustee for the COMMODORE BERNARD L. KNOST Trophy and is hereby granted the power and authority to provide for its maintenance and safekeeping.

The trophy will be held and displayed by the Yacht Club of which the winner is a member. Moreover, said yacht club may permit the use of the trophy by the winner at intervals mutually agreed upon, but said Yacht Club will provide for safekeeping of the trophy.

Each year the names of the winning skipper, together with the name of the yacht club represented, and the year, shall be engraved upon the trophy in plain block letters; capital letters shall be 3/16 of an inch and small letters shall be 1/8 of an inch.

In the event insufficient interest or other reasons occur in the area eliminations of the Women's National Sailing Championship, then the Gulf Yachting Association as trustee shall have the right to designate some other perpetual and annual interest commensurate with the purpose of advancing and encouraging the science of sailing and yachting. In the event the Gulf Yachting Association has the trophy returned it shall be kept at the Pass Christian Yacht Club.

Any and all rules and regulations pertaining to competition for this trophy, as set forth by the Gulf Yachting Association, acting through its Board of Directors or its designated representatives, shall be binding upon all participants and shall be final, nothing herein shall be construed to alter rules and regulations of the North American Yacht Racing Union, the Women's National Sailing Association, or the official Southern Area Group of the North American Yacht Racing Union.

The base was made in 1954 by Ruppert Kohlmaier of New Orleans; the core is made of spanish cedar covered with inlaid veneer, combining black walnut, birds-eye walnut, rosewood and ebony; the shield and silver band on the base was made also in 1954 by Coleman Adler & Sons of New Orleans. The silver band has sufficient space for 32 years of competition, provided the engraving is limited as per the "deed of gift" to plain block letters - the capital lettering shall be 3/16" and the small lettering shall be 1/8".







One of the most valuable perpetual trophies owned by the Gulf Yachting Association, this sterling silver Fish Class Sloop is inscribed with the following hallmarks:



The sterling silver sloop is mounted atop a mahogany base adorned with silver plates engraved with names of winning yacht clubs.

The trophy was presented in 1961 by friends of John Curren. In 1969, Hurricane Camille took away all but the sails. In 2001 friends of John Curren and the Fish Class had the trophy restored.

## The John G. Curren Fish Class Trophy

This sterling silver replica of the 1919-design Fish Class sailboat was originally provided in 1961 by friends of John G. Curren, following his untimely death, in memory of his untiring efforts to promote the sport of yachting among clubs of the Gulf Yachting Association. The trophy was raced for at the annual Mardi Gras Regatta at the New Orleans Yacht Club.

In 1969, Hurricane Camille, as it devastated the Mississippi Coast, brought about the loss of all parts of the trophy except the sails, which were salvaged intact.

For most of the ensuing 30 years, the Fish Class was relatively inactive. Toward the end of the century, there developed a resurgence of interest in restoring old Fish boats, construction of several new ones, and extensively racing them together. This prompted friends of the Class and GYA club members who recognized the impact of the Fish Class to one-design racing in the Northern Gulf to restore this trophy through contributions to the GYA Foundation.

Concurrently, the GYA elected to establish a first-ever GYA Fish Class Championship, an interclub event, to be sailed annually at the Buccaneer Yacht Club on Mobile Bay. This trophy will be presented annually to the winning yacht club to keep for a year, and the host club will present keeper awards.

Should interest in competition in the above manner decline, the GYA Board of Directors may designate another purpose for award of the trophy





The GYA 420 Championship Trophy is a wooden ship's wheel with a brass plate covering the hub, with "GULF YACHTING ASSOCIATION CHAMPIONSHIP" clockwise around the circumference of the plate. "420" is engraved in middle of the brass plate in larger lettering. Block upper case lettering is used. There are six wooden spokes that are carved with a spool motif. The outer ring ha small brass plates with smooth rounded edges. The names of the skipper, crew yacht club and year are inscribed on the plates in block lettering.

## donated by The Pensacola Beach Yacht Club

The GYA Women's PHRF Championship Perpetual Trophy will be awarded to the overall winner of the Gulf Yachting Association's Women's PHRF Championships' Spinnaker fleet and will be housed in the yacht club of the skipper of the winning boat for one year as outlined by the Deed of Gift. The GYA has a program in effect for the receipt, care, maintenance and replacement of perpetual trophies. Perpetual trophies may be donated by an individual, a business, a group or a club. John Mathews is the Chairman of the GYA Trophy Committee. Once approved by the PBYC Board of Directors/Flag Officers, this proposal will be presented to the GYA for their consideration. If the GYA accepts the proposal of this trophy, then a Deed of Gift will be submitted as outlined by GYA guidelines.

Description of proposed perpetual trophy: Clear crystal stylized sailboat on blue tinted crystal base that measures approximately 5 3/4" x 2 3/4" x 7 1/4", to be mounted on a walnut base that measures 6" x 6" x 3" that will have a plate engraved with the name of the trophy and sponsor. Then, this will be mounted on another walnut base that measures 11" x 11" x 3", that will accommodate 24 blank, silver colored aluminum plates that measure 3" x 1" (4 sides, 6 per side); blank plates will be pre-mounted with screws. The type face used will be Times Roman and the size of the type will be 12 point (or as close as possible to accommodate name) on all engraved plates. The type shall be upper and lower case and will be centered on each plate and will include the year, the winning skipper's name and the boat name. Please see attached for picture of sailboat and sketch of the proposed trophy. A carrying case will be constructed to house the trophy for relocation purposes.

- I. Opening Statement The Pensacola Beach Yacht Club gives to the Gulf Yachting Association a perpetual trophy described as a crystal sailboat mounted on a walnut base to be so named The GYA Women's PHRF Championship Perpetual Trophy. This trophy is to be presented to the overall winner of the Gulf Yachting Association (GYA) Women's Performance Handicap Racing Fleet (PHRF) Championship Competing in the Spinnaker Fleet.
- II. Purpose The Pensacola Beach Yacht Club has long been a supporter of women's sailing on the Gulf Coast and continues to do so. In 2001, the Gulf Yachting Association created the Women's PHRF Championship. This trophy will recognize the overall winner of that regatta. The Pensacola Beach Yacht Club wishes to recognize, through the gift of this trophy, the competitive spirit of women's sailing on the Gulf Coast.
- III. Selection Process The overall winning boat of the PHRF Spinnaker fleet participating in the sanctioned event shall be awarded *The GYA Women's PHRF Championship Perpetual Trophy* (utilizing the current *Racing Rules of Sailing* to decide the overall winner of individual or multiple classes or fleets including tie-breakers). If for whatever reason the regatta is not held during a particular year, the Trophy will be retained by the GYA until the next race is held.

Racing and Eligibility Requirements (See GYA Directory Section M-57 GYA Women's PHRF Championship)— the following are required for the Trophy to be awarded:

- There will be an annual regatta consisting of at least two races.
- There shall be no males aboard any of the boats competing in the class (es) eligible for this Trophy.
- Entrants shall be members of GYA Clubs. There shall be no limit to the number of entries per club.
- 4) All entrants shall have a Skipper and crew.
- 5) A Skipper is the Responsible Person in Charge aboard a boat while racing. Skippers shall be female and have been a member of a GYA Club for at least the three months preceding the event.
- Crew shall be all female. At least one-half of the crew racing on each boat shall be members of a GYA Club.
- IV. Re-dedication The GYA Women's PHRF Championship Perpetual Trophy may be rededicated if there is no longer a GYA Women's PHRF Championship. The Trophy may be rededicated to the overall winner of a similar GYA Sanctioned Event that meets the Racing and Eligibility Requirements of this Trophy. Rededication shall be approved by the then-current Board

of Directors of the GYA and the then-current Board of Directors of Pensacola Beach Yacht Club if it is a member of the GYA at that time.

V. Care of Trophy – The GYA has a program in effect for the care and maintenance of trophies. The Trophy may be displayed in the winner's Yacht Club until 14 days prior to the next GYA Women's PHRF Championship. At least 14 days prior to the upcoming Championship, the Trophy will be shipped to the Yacht Club hosting that year's Championship.

(Perpetuity – Pensacola Beach Yacht Club recognizes that organizations change over time. If the GYA reorganizes, changes name, merges with another Regional Sailing Association, splits, disbands, or otherwise has a successor; the Pensacola Beach Yacht Club Perpetual Trophy shall remain in the organization that includes Pensacola Beach. Florida and the rights and responsibilities given to GYA by this Deed of Gift shall transfer to that new entity. Likewise, if a similar type of event happens to Pensacola Beach Yacht Club the rights and responsibilities given to Pensacola Beach Yacht Club shall transfer to that new entity.)

VI. Signing – Final Deed to be dated and signed by the donor (the 2009 Commodore of the Pensacola Beach Yacht Club will sign as representative for the entire club and flag officers), and by the commodore of the GYA, signifying acceptance.

### **Commodore Auguste Capdevielle Trophy**

The Commodore Auguste Capdevielle Memorial Trophy is a large, heavy, sterling silver bowl engraved on the center with a raised red enamel GYA burgee. On the back of the bowl is a raised replica of a fish boat with a red enamel number "9" and a very small red enamel fish on the mainsail of the boat. The winning clubs are engraved in block lettering around the entire circumference of the bowl. An intricate design is repeated six times around the upper part of the base of the bowl which sits on a rounded, graduated base. The bowl sits atop an octagonal base that has eight sterling silver name plates with smoothly rounded corners in each octagonal leg. The above described base sits on a larger octagonal base which also has eight sterling silver name plates.

### Auguste Capdevielle Memorial Trophy

This will document the purchase and dedication by the Gulf Yachting Association in the year 1941 of the Auguste Capdevielle Trophy for overall Gulf Yachting Association interclub competition in club-owned sailboats. The trophy was dedicated in memory of Auguste Capdevielle, who was commodore-president of the GYA from 1936-1939 and a past commodore of the Southern Yacht Club and chairman of its race committee for many years, and who met his untimely death in an automobile accident in the summer of 1940.

The trophy is to be awarded annually at the GYA Opening Regatta to the yacht club which has acquired the best scores in the regattas selected to count for the competition, and a suitable keeper trophy is to be presented to the winner.

The trophy is to be displayed at the winning yacht club, appropriately engraved, and returned by the winner to the Opening Regatta host club unless the GYA elects to take more restrictive steps to protect the trophy.





#### Jack and Flo Scheib Service Award

The GYA has established a service award to honor individuals who over the years have made significant and outstanding contributions in service to the sport of sailing. The award will be named for and dedicated to Jack and Flo Scheib and they will also be the first recipients.

During World War II, Southern Yacht club's clubhouse was turned over to the U S
Government for use by the Navy and Coast Guard. Undaunted, Jack Scheib, then race committee
chairman for SYC still conducted races from the rocks and made sure the results were published.
He was an avid supporter of the sport of sailing and took part in an unprecedented or repeated
string of six strait Lipton victories. He served his own club as race chairman for 6 years and as a
board member. His devotion to the sport earned him honorary memberships, not only in Southern
Yacht Club, but also New Orleans, Buccaneer and Jackson Yacht Clubs.

J. Gilbert (Jack) Scheib served as GYA Commodore and served forty years as the Gulf Yachting Association Secretary-Treasurer until his death in 1980. He was the first Area Chairman and also chairman of the Mallory Cup judges and also served with the Adams and Sears Committees. He was responsible for bringing the prestigious NAYRU (predecessor of USSA) national sailing championships for the Mallory Cup, Adams Cup and Sears Cup to the South for the first time. He served on the executive committee of NAYRU in 1950.

Scheib was been instrumental in getting many people involved and active in the sport from both a participation and administrative standpoint.

Behind every great man is a great woman. Flora Scheib (whom we know as Flo) worked with him, joined him at countless meetings, conferences, regattas, etc. with patience and without a doubt specific and appreciated advice. All of this was done while she was raising 3 children and participating in community activities with specific interest in the Southern Yacht Club. Since 1980 as secretary Emeritus of the GYA, she has cared for and advised the GYA through the years. A celebrity in her own right, Flo has authored a much read and respected book, The "History of the Southern Yacht Club" and is currently working on another book.

It should be obvious from the preceding that Flo and Jack Scheib have earned the title Mr. and Mrs. GYA.

This award is a tribute to Jack and Flo Scheib who have both dedicated their lives in service to the GYA, both on and off the water.

It is appropriate that the first GYA Service Award be presented to Jack and Flo Scheib.

The perpetual award will be presented each year at the Annual Winter Meeting in December. An appropriate keeper plaque will also be presented to each recipient of the award.

Now Therefore Be it Resolved, that the Gulf Yachting Association hereby establishes the GYA Judge Emeritus Award to be administered as follows:

Description of Award: The award is a large wooden plaque with a stainless steel Header plate engraved with the GYA logo and "Gulf Yachting Association Judge Emeritus". There will be additional stainless steel plates available for each judge emeritus and they will be engraved with the recipient's name and year emeritus status was awarded. A record of the recipients shall be maintained and published in the Gulf Yachting Association Directory.

Keeper Awards: A standardized keeper award provided by the GYA shall be awarded to those selected to receive this award at the GYA Awards Banquet or Annual Meeting.

Selection of Recipients: Recipients must have been recognized and/or certified by the national authority and have served in the GYA for at least 5 years. This award is to be given only to those that are no longer actively engaged in judging and should only go to those that have performed long and meritorious service to the sport of sailing. Nominations for this award may be made by any active GYA Certified Judge and the status may only be awarded by unanimous vote of the GYA Executive Committee and the GYA Administrative Judge. The award may be made posthumously.

Rededication: This award shall not be rededicated to any other use unless said usage is approved by the Gulf Yachting Association Board of Directors and said usage is related to judging sailing events. Should there be a change in or deletion of the Certified Judge Program, other qualifications may be established as appropriate by the GYA Board of Directors.

Care of the Award: This award shall be kept at a GYA member Club that is willing to display the award and which has been approved by the GYA Executive Committee to maintain the award as required for other awards owned by the GYA. The award shall be made available for awarding as indicated above.

Recipients must have been recognized and/or certified by the national authority and have served in the GYA for at least 5 years. This award is to be given only to those that are no longer actively engaged in judging and will only be awarded to those that have performed long and meritorious service to the sport of sailing. Nominations for this award may be made by any active GYA Certified Judge and the status may only be awarded by unanimous vote of the GYA Executive Committee and the GYA Administrative Judge. The award may be made posthumously.

The recipients of the award are named on a 22-in. by 28-in.wooden plaque with a 5-in. by 14 ½-in. stainless steel header and 32, 1-in. by 3 ½-in. stainless steel name plates. The header is engraved with the GYA logo and "Gulf Yachting Association, Judge Emeritus". Name plates are engraved with the name of the recipient and the year the award was made.



A keeper award will be provided to each recipient. The GYA Trophy Committee will be responsible for keeping the award updated and for providing keeper awards. The award shall be kept at a GYA member club that is willing to display the award and maintain it as regulred for other trophies and awards owned by the GYA. The plaque shall be made available for award presentations as necessary. Initially is recommended the award be kept by the Bay Waveland Yacht Club.

A record of the recipients of the GYA Judge Emeritus Award shall be maintained in the Gulf Yachting Association Directory and preserved in the historical records of the organization.

Original funding of the award was provided through the GYA Foundation using funds donated in memory of Capt. Peter A. Morrill who is also one of the initial recipients of the award. 


